PERKINS: Oh, the shelter. 18 MS. MADDEN: The shelter, they've got 19 -- the new tables are up there. All the new 20 picnic tables are up there, but, no, they haven't 21 had time to -- are you talking about, like, the 22 shingles and the painting? Yeah, no. 23 MR. SANDS: I think they're working 24 on North -- North Church Street right now. 25 MS. MADDEN: Right.</p>	<p>2</p>	<p>1 secure the trash cans when the wind blows so it 2 doesn't knock 'em over. You know, I can give you 3 an idea, but, you know, somebody put a hole in it, 4 put a chain around it. 21	<p>1 MS. STAR: Yeah. I have I guess a</p> <p>2 few things since it's been a while since I last</p> <p>3 updated you guys. So we are starting Camp Connect</p> <p>4 on June 10th and it will go until June 27th. It</p> <p>5 will be Monday through Thursday, 9 to 1 and we are</p> <p>6 still taking young leader applications, those are</p> <p>7 the elementary school students. And they do have</p> <p>8 a fee. We're working on the fee, getting it to a</p> <p>9 manageable level for New Lebanon residents and</p> <p>10 they can pay the first day of camp.</p> <p>11 We have a new event that is movie in</p> <p>12 the park, we're doing a collaboration with the</p> <p>13 Brethren church, that would be June 14th and June</p> <p>14 [sic] 12th at 8:30, at a little park in a little</p> <p>15 while. And then --</p> <p>16 MR. SANDS: What's the event?</p> <p>17 MS. STAR: We'll show a movie.</p> <p>18 MR. SANDS: Oh, okay.</p> <p>19 MS. MADDEN: It's movie in the park.</p> <p>20 MR. SANDS: She said just an event.</p> <p>21 She didn't say what the event was.</p> <p>22 MS. MADDEN: Oh. It's a movie.</p> <p>23 MR. SANDS: Okay. It's a movie.</p> <p>24 MS. MADDEN: It's a movie. The lilac bushes that were in before</p> <p>20 are now in pots and we'll probably be giving them</p> <p>21 away at a garden giveaway soon. We put compost</p> <p>22 down and landscape fabric as well and we planted</p> <p>23 into that. So hopefully we can keep the weeds</p> <p>24 down and keep them at a manageable level.
