2 call to order the December 18, 2018 regular  
3 council meeting. First item on the agenda is the  
4 invocation and then please remain standing for the  
5 Pledge of Allegiance.

6 Dear Father, thank you for this day.  
7 Please guide us and direct us to make good  
8 decisions and help our village. Please protect  
9 our employees as they go through their daily jobs  
10 and after their jobs. Protect our military here  
11 and around the world in Jesus's name we pray,  
12 amen.

13 (Pledge of Allegiance.)

14 MR. ARRIOLA: All right. Next is the  
15 approval of the September 18, 2018 regular meeting  
16 minutes. Are there any corrections or changes  
17 that need to be made to these minutes? All in  
18 favor of these minutes please signify by saying  
19 aye.

20 Aye.

21 All opposed same sign.

22 (No response.)

23 MR. ARRIOLA: Old business. The  
24 third reading of Ordinance 2018-06. An ordinance  
25 to make appropriations for the current expenses

1 and other expenditures of the Village of New  
2 Lebanon, State of Ohio, during the fiscal year  
3 ending December 31, 2019. Any -- third reading,  
4 any questions? Do I have a motion to adopt  
5 ordinance 2018-06?

6 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: So moved.

7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Second.

8 THE CLERK: Mr. Arriola?

9 MR. ARRIOLA: Yes.

10 THE CLERK: Mr. Joy?

11 MR. JOY: Yes.

12 THE CLERK: Ms. Macmann?

13 MS. MACMANN: Yes.

14 THE CLERK: Ms. Madden?

15 MS. MADDEN: Yes.

16 THE CLERK: Ms. McClusky?

17 MS. MCCLUSKY: Yes.

18 THE CLERK: Mr. Sands?

19 MR. SANDS: Yes.

20 THE CLERK: Mr. Thompson?

21 MR. THOMPSON: Yes.

22 THE CLERK: Seven yes, zero no.

23 MR. ARRIOLA: New business,  
24 Resolution 2018-37. The resolution authorizing  
25 municipal manager to execute a lease with Frank J.

1 Hora, Senior, Tukens, LLC, president, to farm  
2 approximately 46 acres, more or less, for a period  
3 of three years commencing January 1st, 2019 and  
4 ending December 31st, 2021 in the amount of \$243  
5 an acre for a total of \$11,178 per year. Any  
6 questions?

7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I do. Where  
8 was that revenue fund? Which fund does it go  
9 into?

10 MR. MARCUS: It goes in the water  
11 fund.

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Okay. We  
13 can't split that up between --

14 MR. MARCUS: No.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: -- 50/50? I  
16 know we talked about that.

17 MR. MARCUS: Huh-uh.

18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No?

19 MR. MARCUS: No.

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No? Okay.

21 All right. Thank you.

22 MR. MARCUS: You're welcome, sir.

23 MR. ARRIOLA: Any other questions?

24 All right. Do we have a motion to adopt  
25 Resolution 2018-37?

1 MR. SANDS: So moved.

2 MS. MADDEN: Second.

3 THE CLERK: Mr. Joy?

4 MR. JOY: Yes.

5 THE CLERK: Ms. Macmann?

6 MS. MACMANN: Yes.

7 THE CLERK: Ms. Madden?

8 MS. MADDEN: Yes.

9 THE CLERK: Ms. McClusky?

10 MS. MCCLUSKY: Yes.

11 THE CLERK: Mr. Sands?

12 MR. SANDS: Yes.

13 THE CLERK: Mr. Thompson?

14 MR. THOMPSON: Yes.

15 THE CLERK: Mr. Arriola?

16 MR. ARRIOLA: Yes.

17 THE CLERK: Seven yes, zero no.

18 MR. ARRIOLA: Next is Resolution

19 2018-38, a resolution amending that 2018

20 appropriations pursuant to Charter 6.07

21 authorizing increases, transfers and reductions in

22 various funds. Any questions? Have a motion to

23 adopt Resolution 2018-38?

24 MS. MCCLUSKY: So moved.

25 MS. MADDEN: Second.

1 THE CLERK: Ms. Macmann?

2 MS. MACMANN: Yes.

3 THE CLERK: Ms. Madden?

4 MS. MADDEN: Yes.

5 THE CLERK: Miss McClusky?

6 MS. MCCLUSKY: Yes.

7 THE CLERK: Mr. Sands?

8 MR. SANDS: Yes.

9 THE CLERK: Mr. Thompson?

10 MR. THOMPSON: Yes.

11 THE CLERK: Mr. Arriola?

12 MR. ARRIOLA: Yes.

13 THE CLERK: Mr. Joy?

14 MR. JOY: Yes.

15 THE CLERK: Seven yes, zero no.

16 MR. ARRIOLA: Public comments, anyone  
17 from the public like to make a comment, please  
18 step forward to the podium and state your name and  
19 address.

20 Okay.

21 MS. CALDWELL: Well, I'm Tina  
22 Caldwell, it's 401 Holderman Place. I just had a  
23 quick question. Our community -- our recreation  
24 community specialist, development specialist, spit  
25 the words out right, did she move to -- I'm pretty

1 sure she moved to Virginia. She's still employed  
2 here?

3 MR. MARCUS: Yes.

4 MS. CALDWELL: Okay. So she's going  
5 to be employed from a different state? And we  
6 have no intentions of hiring someone else that's  
7 --

8 MR. MARCUS: Not at this point in  
9 time. The position is full.

10 MS. CALDWELL: Okay.

11 MR. ARRIOLA: Anything else?

12 MS. BEMIS: Goodevening. Shannon  
13 Bemis, 130 Bronwood Street. I had a quick  
14 question on that resolution, amending the 2008  
15 [sic] appropriations pursuant, you know, to the  
16 charter. Increases, transfers and reduction of  
17 various funds. So I'm assuming council gets a  
18 printout of what reduction in funds and transfers?

19 MR. ARRIOLA: We will see all of it  
20 as it -- things are moved.

21 MS. BEMIS: Okay. And then off of  
22 what -- what she just said, because I thought it  
23 was a rumor so it just verified. So she did move  
24 to Virginia. So we're paying somebody that lives  
25 out of state?

1 MS. MADDEN: I think we talked about  
2 this last time too, that she's working part time  
3 remotely. Did we not discuss this last time?

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: We did.

5 MS. MADDEN: I think we answered this  
6 last time too. She's working part time remotely  
7 and she's coming back -- 'cause we even talked  
8 about she would be back for the Christmas in the  
9 Village and she was coming back for certain  
10 functions.

11 MS. BEMIS: Well -- excuse me --

12 MS. MADDEN: And she's only working  
13 what, less than 20 hours or about 20 hours.

14 MR. MARCUS: If there's no events --

15 MS. MADDEN: If there's no events --

16 MR. MARCUS: -- (indiscernible).

17 MS. MADDEN: -- she's not at all.

18 MS. BEMIS: I mean she worked 170  
19 hours in the month of November.

20 MS. MADDEN: And we were getting  
21 ready for Christmas --

22 MS. BEMIS: From Virginia.

23 MS. MADDEN: -- in the village.

24 MS. BEMIS: 170 hours -- I mean,  
25 that's -- okay. No. The -- my understanding was



1 that she was away on a work study and while she  
2 was away on the work study she would have to be,  
3 you know, communicating remotely.

4 MS. MADDEN: Right.

5 MS. BEMIS: But the way that made  
6 that sound is, okay, she's on a work study, she  
7 lives -- this is still her home base. Now she's  
8 entirely moved to a different state. So to pay  
9 somebody, in my opinion just to express the board,  
10 to pay somebody, you know, where Marcus, I know  
11 you said she'd work 16 or 20 hours per week, 170  
12 hours in the month of November and -- I mean, it's  
13 pretty typical each month, that to me is a lot of  
14 money spent for someone to work remotely.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Shannon, the  
16 payroll, maybe Brenda would know. Generally  
17 speaking, your payroll is generally like a week  
18 and a half, two weeks behind so there may be some  
19 October time in the November payroll.

20 MS. ETTER: There is. There was  
21 three paychecks --

22 MS. BEMIS: Right.

23 MS. ETTER: -- actually dated in  
24 November, in the month of November.

25 MS. BEMIS: Right. And I calculated

1 that even on the high side and still it's 144  
2 hours. So it's still, like -- for somebody to not  
3 live here that's a lot of hours.

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: What I'm  
5 getting at is normally your first payroll in  
6 November has October hours.

7 MS. ETTER: Uh-huh.

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: That's where I  
9 was going. So you may have 80 hours that were  
10 paid out in November, that was actually for  
11 October time.

12 MS. BEMIS: Right. Well, and I was  
13 taking -- yeah, that into consider -- for  
14 Halloween in the Village and stuff. But then  
15 looking at everybody else in the department,  
16 nobody else was -- I just -- you know, on the  
17 record, if -- if she's gone, then in my opinion, I  
18 don't feel like we should be paying somebody X  
19 amount of dollars or X amount of hours to be  
20 working remotely when we can find somebody in the  
21 village that can be doing the job so...

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I -- I guess I  
23 understand your point. I think telecommuting and  
24 with technology, a lot can get done.

25 MS. BEMIS: Yeah.

1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: In fact I get  
2 more done away from the office than I do in the  
3 office sometimes.

4 MS. BEMIS: Well, I mean, this isn't  
5 New York or Chicago or LA. This is the Village of  
6 New Lebanon. And I just think that to me, it's --  
7 I just wanted to have it on record that I'm  
8 opposed to that.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: I have 12  
10 people that work for me and none of them are in an  
11 office. All of them work from home.

12 MS. BEMIS: Yeah. Okay. Like I  
13 said, I just wanted to put that -- I just don't  
14 think it's appropriate with funding so thank you.

15 MR. ARRIOLA: I wasn't here at the  
16 last meeting so has she actually moved?

17 MS. MADDEN: I've not heard that she  
18 officially moved from New Lebanon --

19 MR. MARCUS: Yeah, we don't have a  
20 change of address on her yet.

21 MS. MADDEN: Don't have a change of  
22 address or along those lines.

23 MR. ARRIOLA: Well, that's what I was  
24 -- okay. All right.

25 MS. MADDEN: So that's a rumor

1 through town apparently.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER:

3 (Indiscernible.)

4 MS. MADDEN: Okay.

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER:

6 (Indiscernible) Christmas thing.

7 MR. MARCUS: Well, we don't have a  
8 change of address on file or anything yet,  
9 Shannon.

10 MR. ARRIOLA: Okay. All right.  
11 Administrative staff comments, police chief. No  
12 police chief.

13 MR. MARCUS: He is on vacation. He  
14 has no comments, sir.

15 MR. ARRIOLA: All right. Fire chief.

16 MR. MARCUS: Also no comments.

17 MR. ARRIOLA: Any comments from the  
18 fire chief?

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: No.

20 MR. ARRIOLA: Oh, it's looking good  
21 over at the fire station since --

22 MR. MARCUS: Yeah, they're almost  
23 finished. If they get their finals in this week,  
24 we'll probably have a C of O for the weekend and  
25 if not, we're hoping we'll get it at least Monday

1 to be able to get them in there.

2 MR. ARRIOLA: Okay. That's good.  
3 Zoning compliance officer, David.

4 MR. LUNSFORD: (Indiscernible) the  
5 manager in his issues and update mentioned that  
6 (indiscernible) and they dug some ditches and they  
7 (indiscernible) and that's it. I have no  
8 (indiscernible).

9 MR. ARRIOLA: Any questions for  
10 David?

11 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: David, that  
12 house over there on Johnsville Brookville, with  
13 the RV.

14 MR. LUNSFORD: Yes.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: It's still  
16 there but now there is a truck there. They moved  
17 the trailer that was there.

18 MR. LUNSFORD: Okay.

19 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: But now  
20 there's a truck there that's disabled. That's not  
21 moving.

22 MR. LUNSFORD: I'll look into it.

23 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thank you.

24 MR. LUNSFORD: (Indiscernible)  
25 property owners.

1 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: That would be  
2 my guess also but if you could look into it, that  
3 would be great.

4 MR. ARRIOLA: How about the house  
5 over on (indiscernible), Dave, that they're  
6 redoing, you know, the one they gutted, got the  
7 new garage door on and I know they moved the big  
8 dumpster but it still looks like they left a lot  
9 of stuff there on the driveway and the front yard.

10 MR. LUNSFORD: (Indiscernible.)

11 MR. ARRIOLA: Hmm?

12 MR. LUNSFORD: I was going to say, I  
13 got rid of the tires.

14 MR. ARRIOLA: Yeah. Oh, you did?

15 MR. LUNSFORD: Yeah.

16 (Indiscernible).

17 MR. ARRIOLA: Okay.

18 MS. MADDEN: Wait. I have one more  
19 question for David. On Lawson, I had you go down  
20 there and look at Lawson. Did you find anything,  
21 was there anything there?

22 MR. LUNSFORD: (Indiscernible.)

23 MS. MADDEN: Okay.

24 MR. LUNSFORD: Yeah, I'm still --

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Okay. If you

1 could just keep checking on it. Thank you.

2 MR. LUNSFORD: I figured this week I  
3 would just see (indiscernible).

4 MS. MADDEN: True. Thank you.

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: David, I had a  
6 question here too. Over here by the little mall  
7 area by the (indiscernible) diner, is that a  
8 portable generator they've got sitting out over  
9 there by the pharmacy?

10 MR. LUNSFORD: They're doing some  
11 work (indiscernible).

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Is that what  
13 they're doing?

14 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: They are  
15 actually remodeling the bathrooms and those are  
16 portable bathrooms for the employees to use while  
17 they're --

18 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Portable  
19 bathrooms, oh, wow.

20 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: -- remodeling  
21 the CVS bathrooms.

22 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thank you.

23 MR. ARRIOLA: Anything else?

24 MS. MADDEN: That's it.

25 MR. ARRIOLA: Okay. Chief financial

1 officer. Brenda.

2 MS. ETTER: Nothing tonight, sir.

3 MR. ARRIOLA: Anything for Brenda?

4 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Okay.

5 MR. ARRIOLA: Okay. Do I have a

6 motion to accept the November 2018 financial

7 report?

8 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: So moved.

9 MS. MADDEN: Second.

10 THE CLERK: Ms. Macmann?

11 MS. MACMANN: Yes.

12 THE CLERK: Ms. Madden?

13 MS. MADDEN: Yes.

14 THE CLERK: Ms. McClusky?

15 MS. MCCLUSKY: Yes.

16 THE CLERK: Mr. Sands?

17 MR. SANDS: Yes.

18 THE CLERK: Mr. Thompson?

19 MR. THOMPSON: Yes.

20 THE CLERK: Mr. Arriola?

21 MR. ARRIOLA: Yes.

22 THE CLERK: Mr. Joy?

23 MR. JOY: Yes.

24 THE CLERK: Seven yes, zero no.

25 MR. ARRIOLA: All right. Service



1 department superintendent, Scott.

2 MR. BROCK: I don't have anything  
3 tonight.

4 MR. ARRIOLA: Anything for Scott?  
5 Okay. Parks and rec, Margo.

6 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Good evening.  
7 Our ongoing -- I've divided tonight up into  
8 ongoing, upcoming. Our ongoing projects are the  
9 What's New that I gave you each a copy of for the  
10 week. And the welcome bags, we're continuing  
11 preparing welcome bags to newcomers to the  
12 community and deliveries are continuing every week  
13 and we realized as we were thinking about during  
14 the summer we were delivering produce to these  
15 people who couldn't get to the garden and that is  
16 a healthy option. And then we went to with this  
17 donation we received canned goods and that is not  
18 always a healthy option. And so I was starting to  
19 feel a little sensitive to that and found that I  
20 can -- there are some vegetables that I can get  
21 pretty cheaply too, almost as cheap as a can of  
22 soup. So I've started to put fresh vegetables in  
23 the bags too and fresh fruit and I feel really  
24 good about that -- that shift and we're continuing  
25 to have baked goods too and we'll have a special

1 bag for the Christmas and winter holidays.

2 I just learned today that one of the  
3 people I deliver to is now in hospice so we can  
4 keep -- keep the families in the community -- I'm  
5 sure there are lots of other families in the  
6 community in that situation too but we can just  
7 keep them in our thoughts.

8 Upcoming projects, we're working on  
9 finalizing the 2019 calendar, picking dates and  
10 setting those. The winter yoga series is going to  
11 start January 9 now and will go through February  
12 13 and that will be \$5 per class prepaid. We're  
13 in the beginning stages of planning the garden for  
14 2019 and also planning the -- some give away  
15 activities to expand that a little bit, some  
16 simple things. And I'm planning to slip in some  
17 herb growing along the edges of the garden too to  
18 sell at Bayer Melon Farm this season for a little  
19 extra income too for the garden. So I'm pretty  
20 excited about that. I don't think that's going to  
21 impact what we're able to produce at all because  
22 I'll be able to use the edges of beds and things  
23 like that so...

24 And lastly we're organizing the 2018  
25 grant projects that are going to be finished and

1 installed early next year. The one from  
2 Montgomery County Solid Waste and also the one  
3 from the rotary district grant. That last one was  
4 for benches along Main Street and so those things  
5 will be finalized coming here in the next month or  
6 two. That's everything I have tonight. Are there  
7 any questions?

8 MS. MADDEN: On the yoga you said the  
9 \$5 if they prepay. If they don't prepay, if they  
10 just show up, is there an extra charge?

11 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: If they show  
12 up, my understanding is -- there's not an  
13 additional charge.

14 MS. MADDEN: Still \$5.

15 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: But you can't  
16 pay in cash and the teacher can't accept money.  
17 So there -- I think there may be envelopes that  
18 people can write checks and put into the drop box;  
19 is that correct?

20 MS. MADDEN: Okay.

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: You cannot put  
22 cash into a drop box.

23 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Not cash.  
24 You'd have to write checks.

25 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: It will have

1 to be check or money order.

2 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Right.

3 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Check or money  
4 order.

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Uh-hum. Yeah.  
6 And I don't -- yeah.

7 MS. MADDEN: That's fine. I was just  
8 curious.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: It -- it will  
10 be interesting to see how that transition shifts.  
11 It will probably be a little rocky at first until  
12 people get used to the process. But that's good.  
13 And also I just wanted to mention this time of  
14 night is bedtime for my two little ones at home  
15 and so I'm going to be passing this responsibility  
16 off to Star in the new year so I can be home at  
17 that special time that I treasure. So it's been  
18 nice to be with y'all and you'll see Star next  
19 time.

20 MR. ARRIOLA: Thanks, Margo.

21 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Thank you,  
22 Margo.

23 MR. ARRIOLA: All right. Municipal  
24 manager comments.

25 MR. MARCUS: Sandy, can you give us a

1 quick update on Rumpke.

2 MS. WRIGHT: Okay. Rumpke's last day  
3 of service will be December 26th. They will be  
4 moving -- Republic's last day. They will be  
5 removing the carts and commercial carts once last  
6 collection has been made. So I'm not sure what  
7 that date's going to be but it will be after the  
8 26th.

9 I had a letter from Rumpke telling me  
10 today that -- or a note that they were going to  
11 start putting out the dumpsters -- the dumpsters  
12 and the trash totes and recycle bins on Thursday  
13 morning to the residents. The letter went out to  
14 the residents from Rumpke giving them details, it  
15 went out on the 17th and they hope that they have  
16 -- they mailed them first class and they hope that  
17 they have them no later than Wednesday so -- so we  
18 hope that works out.

19 Their first day of service will be  
20 Wednesday, January 2nd, 2019. The -- in this one,  
21 the bulk items are limited to one item per week  
22 and they have to be scheduled with Rumpke, not  
23 with our office. They'll have a number on the  
24 letter that will tell them that. They are also  
25 going to bring bags because we have -- they have

1 to wrap -- they have to wrap their mattresses,  
2 sofas anything like that. They're going to supply  
3 the bags here. We'll have them here to sell.  
4 It's \$7 apiece. And they can get a full sofa, a  
5 mattress and box spring in it. So there's no  
6 problem. And they're heavy duty. We're not --

7 MR. MARCUS: I think that's either a  
8 full sofa or a mattress and box springs.

9 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Well, he  
10 said --

11 MS. MADDEN: I was going to say that  
12 is a big bag.

13 MS. WRIGHT: (Indiscernible)  
14 sometimes you can get them in there if you stand  
15 it up right. I said good luck with that. We're  
16 not going to make any money on them but we're  
17 going to have them here for the residents that  
18 want to come in and buy them.

19 MS. MADDEN: Okay.

20 MR. MARCUS: And they can also  
21 purchase their own if they wish but ours are  
22 supposed to be at a discount rate according to the  
23 contractor.

24 MS. WRIGHT: (Indiscernible) if they  
25 want a new -- another recycle bin or another --

1 because I think the recycle bins are, like, what  
2 did they say, 18 gallon recycle bin free of charge  
3 and you go to 95 gallon brown trash carts and they  
4 do have the 800 number that they can contact. I  
5 have -- they ask to contact them 48 hours in  
6 advance to schedule bulk pickup.

7 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: The bulk  
8 pickup can be done on any other day once you give  
9 them the 48 hour notice or the same day that they  
10 do the trash collection?

11 MS. WRIGHT: Tuesdays. Tuesdays.

12 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Okay.

13 MS. WRIGHT: They will still be  
14 around the area because they cover the outer  
15 communities around; and if there's a problem, all  
16 we have to do is call if there's a problem. It's  
17 nice because these people have a telephone number  
18 they can contact because on Mondays, the biggest  
19 part of my job on Mondays was calling in bulk  
20 pickup and on Wednesdays it was calling in trash  
21 removal -- for (indiscernible).

22 MR. MARCUS: Which won't happen  
23 anymore, because it will be self service each  
24 community member that wants something picked up or  
25 has a problem will have a number and that letter

1 to call and resolve the issue themselves.

2 MS. MADDEN: I like that better.

3 MS. WRIGHT: I don't have to do that  
4 anymore.

5 UNIDENTIFIED SPEAKER: Now, the  
6 totes -- one last question, on the totes, will  
7 they have numbers assigned to each house or --

8 MS. WRIGHT: Yes. They have -- they  
9 had a list of addresses and those trash totes will  
10 have a little number plate on it and they -- they  
11 know to blip like that and where it belongs. No  
12 matter where they find it, they'll know where it  
13 belongs. It will come back to that address so we  
14 won't have to trace it.

15 MR. ARRIOLA: Okay.

16 MS. WRIGHT: Which is good too. So  
17 we hope. Anything new, sometimes you don't know.

18 MR. MARCUS: Is that it? Thank you.

19 All right. And then under manager  
20 comments, requesting an executive session to  
21 discuss some personnel issues and two contracts.

22 MR. ARRIOLA: Okay. Any questions  
23 for the manager?

24 MS. MADDEN: Oh, I do have -- I  
25 attended the Montgomery County auditor's update



1 last week and I have the paperwork from that.

2 MR. MARCUS: Okay. Thank you.
