The Council of the Municipality of New Lebanon, Ohio, met in regular session on Tuesday, February 18, 2020 at 7:30 p.m. with Mayor Arriola presiding. Present were Law Director Ronald D. Keener, Chief Financial Officer Brenda Etter, Police Chief Rick Daulton, Fire Chief J.C. Keyser, Code Enforcement Administrator Melody Davis, Clerk of Council Sandy Wright, and several visitors. Municipal Manager Glenna A. Madden and Service Department Superintendent Scott Brock were absent.

ROLL CALL

The following members were present at the Call to Order: Raymond Arriola, Carol Macmann, Susan Nickerson, Lyndon Perkins, Christopher Sands, and Douglas Thompson. Gale Joy was absent.

INVOCATION

Pastor Kirchoffer from the New Lebanon Assembly of God gave the invocation.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Mayor Arriola stated next is the approval of the February 4, 2020 Regular Meeting Minutes.

Mayor Arriola asked are there any corrections or changes that need to be made to these minutes. Nothing was heard.

Mayor Arriola stated all in favor of these minutes please signify by saying aye, all opposed same sign.

VOICE VOTE. ALL IN FAVOR. MOTION CARRIED.

OLD BUSINESS

Mayor Arriola stated under old business we have the Mayoral Board Appointments. We had several citizens submit letters of interest for the different vacancies. We have four (4) boards with openings. This is the first time since I have been on council that so many people sent letters of interest. I was really pleased to see that. We have one (1) opening on the Board of Tax Appeals. I appoint Tammy Loch with a term expiring December 31, 2021; One (1) opening on the Personnel Appeals Board. I appoint Tom Simon with a term expiring December 31, 2020; One (1) opening on the Planning Board. I appoint George Rickett with a term expiring 12-31-21; Two (2) openings on the Parks and Recreation Road. I appoint Linda Lewis and Randy Junemann with a term expiring 12-31-22.

NEW BUSINESS

Mayor Arriola stated next is new business **RESOLUTION 2020-02. A RESOLUTION AMENDING RESOLUTION 2019-12 FROM AUTHORIZING THE MUNICIPAL MANAGER TO PURCHASE A 2020 FORD POLICE INTERCEPTOR UTILITY AWD FROM STATEWIDE FORD LINCOLN MERCURY, INC., 1108 W. MAIN STREET, VAN WERT, OHIO 45891 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$32,827.00 FOR USE AS A MARKED POLICE VEHICLE TO**

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AUTHORIZING THE MUNICIPAL MANAGER TO PURCHASE A 2020 CHEVY TAHOE 4WD FROM GANLEY CHEVROLET OF AURORA, 310 WEST GARFIELD RD., AURORA, OHIO 44202 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$36,470.60 STATE BID PRICE FOR USE AS A MARKED POLICE VEHICLE.

Council Member Thompson stated this is the one that was budgeted at \$40,000.

Police Chief Daulton stated this was \$40,000 to include all the equipment on it. We have been waiting 11 months for the Ford that has not come in. They cannot give me a delivery date for the Ford Police Interceptor and they have no idea how long it will be.

This is cancelling the Ford Police Interceptor out of the 2019 budget and purchasing a 2020 Chevy Tahoe that is in stock out of the 2019 budget.

Council Member Sands stated that is with all of the equipment that you need.

Police Chief Daulton stated that \$36,470.60 does not include the equipment.

Council Member Thompson stated it is my understanding the appropriation would come out of 2020 budget. The 2019 budget is closed. I know you had it in the 2019 budget.

Council Member Thompson stated Brenda is here. I will ask you the question. I did not see you sitting over there. Good evening, hi.

Chief Financial Officer Etter stated I am hiding.

Council Member Thompson stated good evening, hi.

Chief Financial Officer Etter stated both are coming out of the 2020 budget basically.

Council Member Thompson asked what was the budget amount for that one?

Chief Financial Officer Etter stated it was \$40,000. That was for everything as far as I can remember.

Council Member Thompson stated I have \$40,000 in my notes. Thank you.

Council Member Nickerson asked how many total cruisers are we getting in 2020, the one from 2019 and the other from 2020. Are they both marked cruisers?

Police Chief Daulton stated marked

Council Member Nickerson stated I remember you had asked for an unmarked cruiser also. Okay a total of three (3) new cruisers for this year. How many officers do you have?

Police Chief Daulton stated counting part-time we have 13 right now. (not audible)

Council Member Nickerson asked how many cruisers do you have right now?

Police Chief Daulton stated we have 5 and 1 is down with the transmission out. We have 1 right now with over 100,000 miles (not audible)

Council Member Nickerson stated there were several vehicles on Govdeals. Has anything happened with those yet?

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Police Chief Daulton stated no.

Mayor Arriola stated anything else. Nothing was heard.

Mayor Arriola stated do I have a motion to adopt Resolution 2020-02.

Motion by Council Member Sands, second by Council Member Nickerson to adopt Resolution 2020-02.

Mayor Arriola stated next is **RESOLUTION 2020-03. A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MUNICIPAL MANAGER TO PURCHASE A 2020 CHEVY TAHOE 4WD FROM GANLEY CHEVROLET OF AURORA, 310 WEST GARFIELD RD., AURORA, OHIO 44202 IN THE AMOUNT OF \$36,470.60 STATE BID PRICE FOR USE AS A MARKED POLICE VEHICLE.**

Mayor Arriola stated any questions.

Council Member Thompson stated I don't want to be the one always asking question but I have to. I thought we had one marked and one unmarked. I keep hearing 2019.

Police Chief Daulton stated we never got one last year. It was ordered but Ford cannot deliver the car. We have been waiting 11 months for the car. It has not come in. I talked with the dealer and they cannot give me a date.

Council Member Thompson stated we are closed for 2019. I don't recall this third vehicle being in the budget for 2020.

Police Chief Daulton stated we carried the money over from last year because we never purchased the car. We closed that purchase order out because they could not deliver the car.

Council Member Thompson stated the capital package did not clearly show that. It showed the two (2) vehicles unless I am missing something. In the capital package for 2020 shows two vehicles for the police.

Police Chief Daulton stated the vehicle was supposed to come last year.

Council Member Thompson stated we shared with the community that money had been called an encumbrance which expired so it goes back in the reserve. That needs to be put back in as a budget appropriation for 2020. That is how it works in county government. Brenda, if I am wrong let me know. I don't know how we can move forward with the third vehicle if it is not in the budget appropriation for 2020, if someone else has more information, but my understanding was two vehicles, one unmarked and one marked.

Mayor Arriola asked what do you have Brenda?

Chief Financial Officer Etter remarks not audible.

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Council Member Thompson stated so the purchase order has been closed. The purchase order should be closed at 90 days and no more than 120 days.

Council Member Thompson stated I would recommend is that we hold this resolution and any more information about the budget if we do purchase this vehicle where is the money coming from.

Council Member Sands stated then that money from 2019 went back into the reserve balance. We would have to amend the budget to include it.

Council Member Thompson stated that's correct.

Council Member Sands stated this is authorizing them to purchase it.

Council Member Thompson stated it would be a budget appropriation first, then we would have authorizing them to purchase.

Mayor Arriola stated do I have a motion to table Resolution 2020-03.

Council Member Thompson stated I will make the motion to table Resolution 2020-03 and present back as a budget appropriation. Second by Council Member Perkins.

Police Chief Daulton stated they have 50 vehicles in stock. They are going fast. They had 170 vehicles.

Council Member Thompson stated Chief I understand that but it is my duty as an elected official is to try to follow the appropriation process. I want you to have new equipment but how it has been presented at the budget hearing was 2 vehicles. I say table it. I don't have the other mechanism that would allow me to move forward. Again I am looking at all of you. It could be an audit thing. I don't know.

Mayor Arriola stated we will wait until Brenda comes back with the information.

Mayor Arriola stated next is **RESOLUTION 2020-04. A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MUNICIPAL MANAGER TO LEASE/PURCHASE A 2020 ALEXIS TOP CONTROL EQUALIZER DEMO #2361, FIRE ENGINE FROM SUTPHEN CORPORATION, P.O. BOX 158, AMLIN, OHIO 43002 IN THE STATE BID AMOUNT OF \$518,411.00. LEASING COMPANY WILL BE LEASING 2, INC., 1720 WEST CASS STREET, TAMPA, FLORIDA 33606.**

Mayor Arriola stated any questions.

Council Member Perkins stated what kind of warranty is offered and who will perform the maintenance on it.

Fire Chief Keyser stated we have a company that already does maintenance for us. There are different warranties on the water tank and the power train. The truck was built in Illinois but the company we use now is an authorized warranty repair for the truck and so is Heritage in Springfield. The company selling us the truck is an authorized warranty repair. The company selling us the truck will be free from defects in materials and workmanship under normal use and service for a period of one year from date of delivery.

Council Member Perkins stated I am good with that as long as it is in writing.

Fire Chief Keyser stated that is all in the proposal that is 49 pages long.

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Mayor Arriola stated any more questions.

Council Member Sands stated this is a 15 year lease and to lease the whole thing is \$518,000 and it is paid annually so that is like \$34,000 a year.

Fire Chief Keyser stated \$43,000 a year.

Council Member Sands stated you have already set \$50,000 aside to start saving money to build next year.

Fire Chief Keyser stated if you look at the budget on out next year we will set aside \$75,000.

Council Member Sands stated you have to set money aside because they are just falling apart.

Fire Chief Keyser stated correct. At one point in time we were on a 20 to 25 year rotation. Now we have three trucks that are well over 25 years old.

Council Member Nickerson stated the payment of \$43,050 and you already have \$50,000 set aside.

Fire Chief Keyser stated correct. If you look we have \$75,000 for the year after that. The only reason we went with 15 years because the interest rate is the same for 12 years versus 15 years. We probably want carry it for 15 years.

Council Member Thompson stated going back to the last meeting I asked and I want to make certain that I understand what the ask is. I know you are doing your homework, tonight you are asking us to waive the 3 readings and declare an emergency.

Mayor Arriola stated no.

Law Director Ronald Keener stated a resolution does not have 3 readings.

Council Member Thompson stated so this is just a resolution and it does not have 3 readings, to me it sounds like an emergency because the 1992 model engine we are replacing it holds 750 gallons versus the new one that holds 1,000 gallons. Your plan is turn that into an engine rescue. So in other words if we are the first responder on a car accident we will have water on the truck in case of a car fire, etc. Your current two tankers don't have that capability. The other big tankers hold how many gallons.

Fire Chief Keyser stated they hold 1500 gallons.

Council Member Thompson asked if we did nothing tonight what could go wrong?

Fire Chief Keyser stated we could lose it then you are risking paying \$625,000 plus and waiting 14 to 18 months for delivery.

Council Member Thompson stated I'm sorry that was not my question. If we don't spend the money tonight and something happens 3 miles to the south or the north. What risk do we have tonight? If I voted no tonight what would be my risk?

Fire Chief Keyser stated you have a truck sitting there now that is broken down. Anybody could back now and easily say that truck is operational, that truck is in service and this may not have happened. I think it opens up a liability.

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Fire Chief Keyser stated everything is in there.

Mayor Arriola stated any other questions. Nothing was heard.

Mayor Arriola stated do I have a motion to adopt Resolution 2020-04.

Motion by Council Member Sands, second by Council Member Perkins.

ROLL CALL ON ABOVE MOTION. Council Member Perkins, yes; Council Member Sands, yes; Council Member Thompson, yes; Council Member Macmann, yes; Council Member Nickerson, yes; Council Member Arriola, yes; 6 yes 0 no

ALL IN FAVOR. MOTION CARRIED.

Mayor Arriola stated Brenda do you have anything for us.

Chief Financial Officer Etter stated the budget is only showing one like Mr. Thompson said. It is showing being marked. We did not know the other cruiser was not going to come. We had the meeting and the budget was set up. We thought it was coming. Somehow it turned into two (2). That wasn't anything I had to do with.

Council Member Thompson stated I think that not all of us are budget people. I don't think there was any wrong doing it was just a simple over sight.

Council Member Thompson stated I make a motion to hold this resolution and come back around for the discussion and preparation, etc.

Mayor Arriola stated you want a motion to table Resolution 2020-03.

Council Member Thompson stated yes.

Mayor Arriola stated do I have a second.

Second by Council Member Perkins to table Resolution 2020-03.

ROLL CALL ON ABOVE MOTION. Council Member Perkins, yes; Council Member Sands, yes; Council Member Thompson, yes; Council Member Macmann, yes; Council Member Nickerson, yes; Council Member Arriola, yes; 6 yes 0 no

ALL IN FAVOR. MOTION CARRIED. RESOLUTION 2020-03 TABLED.

PUBLIC COMMENTS OR QUESTIONS

Melissa Sexton, 185 Parkview Drive stated earlier I had applied for a position that came available so I ask earlier if there could be an email sent out saying *I have received your email. Thank you for your interest. We will be appointing people at the next meeting on this date on this date because I did not know the appointments were taking place tonight.* When you appoint people for these positions they do not have to be present.

Mayor Arriola stated yes that is correct. When we appoint someone for a Council Seat they have to be present. When appointments are made to the Boards they do not have to be present.

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Council Member Thompson stated so if we had a car accident 2 miles down the road which truck leaves the fire station right now?

Fire Chief Keyser stated the rescue right now which has no water on it. If we don't get enough response, then you wait for Farmersville to come with water.

Council Member Thompson stated prior to this truck breaking down, the other truck was being sent out also.

Fire Chief Keyser stated correct if you staff both you would be running a rescue and another pumper to the call.

Council Member Thompson stated so my risk is, if we do not make this immediate purchase, lease, someone is hurt 2 miles down the road we in essence have done damage to our community. Is that accurate? I am not a Fire Chief and have never worked in a fire department so I don't know all of the equipment.

Fire Chief Keyser stated you may be doing is you may be delaying some needed resources.

Council Member Thompson stated okay, that is fair.

Council Member Nickerson asked are you doing away with the rescue?

Fire Chief Keyser stated we will keep it for ISO. It will become more of what it was originally intended for. It will carry like shore boards for trench rescue and rope rescue and that kind of more specialty rescue stuff. We want to keep our ISO points for that truck. The engine will obviously go.

Council Member Nickerson stated the rescue tools will move to the new engine. Everything will come off the current rescue.

Council Member Thompson stated I have a question. On the state bid price, no matter which vendor we go with, is the state bid price, right.

Fire Chief Keyser stated they list options. Basically when the state bids something they cannot be low, whatever that option is. They say this option is by state bid then they take all those options and add them up. You could mirror image another truck from another manufacturer and they could be higher because they may charge more for the options. The one thing that found out is the reason this truck is so significantly cheaper in price is because when they built the demo a lot of the vendors will come to them because they want their stuff out in the market field. So they will come to them and say we would like you to put these lights on the other end and will charge you cost to put them on or they will say we will give these to you to put on the truck which is the lowest price the manufacturer has in that vehicle because you are not paying as much for the components. If you suspect when you buy it you are going to pay full price for every single thing you put on so that's kind of where the savings comes in the demo so you want all of the bills.

Council Member Perkins asked are all the bells and whistles you want going to be on that truck?

Fire Chief Keyser stated yes.

Council Member Nickerson stated so everything is included in that price.

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Ms. Sexton asked do you appoint from recommendations based on their history or background or their knowledge or is it how they are in the community at any point in time?

Mayor Arriola stated we had quite a few letters expressing interest including yours. I looked at the backgrounds of the individuals and that is how I made the selections. It is not based on how they are involved in the community. Take for example Mr. Simon who has a background with personnel in Brookville with the Police Department. I appointed him to the Personnel Appeals Board because of his experience with personnel.

Ms. Sexton stated and he lives in Brookville.

Mayor Arriola stated he lives here in New Lebanon and he is a Brookville Police Officer.

Mayor Arriola stated Shannon Bemis, 130 Bronwood Street asked do we a fire truck right now that has water or do we not.

Fire Chief Keyser replied yes. We have two tankers right now. The engine is not running and water tank is leaking.

Since Melissa brought it up you saying you look at the applicant's background. What does that mean? What do mean by looking at the background?

Mayor Arriola stated I look at the information they gave me and their experience and why they are interested in serving on the different boards.

Ms. Bemis stated so Personnel Appeals is Tom Simon; Board of Tax Appeals is Tammy Loch and George Rickett is on Planning Board and Linda Lewis and Randy Junemann to the Parks and Recreation Board. You are appointing these and in the Charter it is a council appointment. Is the council aware of all of the people who have put in to be on a board and have you discussed as a council because it is a council appointment not a Mayoral appointment?

Mayor Arriola stated if it goes beyond a certain time period it is a mayoral appointment.

Ms. Bemis stated that is only for the personnel appeals board.

Mayor Arriola stated it is for all of the boards.

Ms. Bemis stated no it is not. According to the charter the appointments you have made are not legal. It is just nice for our council members to know who is putting in for things. That is just a democratic way. Also you have 6 people on the Planning Board and you are supposed to have 5 people; The same people cannot serve on the Planning Board and the BZA Board. I always tell the truth.

Council Member Sands stated I am only on the BZA and Park Board.

Ms. Bemis stated my stepdad who lives at 1211 Sizemore Drive had salt thrown into his garage. I don't know who was driving the truck, but he had a beard. Just pass it along.

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Ms. Bemis asked if council could make some kind of appropriation in the amount of \$50,000 to be put towards the pothole repair. The streets are horrible. The potholes are so large. I drive around town all day and they have not repaired any potholes. Have you driven on S. Church Street? That pothole there is so large a car could be put in it. We can't drive on these streets anymore. Something has to be done. Just give us a flat surface to drive on.

Council Member Sands stated that is to be done this spring when the OPWC project is done.

Council Member Thompson stated you all made fun of me when I suggested a pothole list. When people complain about a pothole we need to record it and then fix it and put it in our packet. I am tired of hearing the issue just like the rest of you. There are new potholes on N. Clayton Road. I think we need to do a pothole list and report out on because they need to be fixed.

Mrs. Bemis stated a few months ago we brought up the hole at Laredo and Estonia.

Council Member Sands stated it is getting larger. I understand the service department is small and they do have other issues to attend to, especially water main breaks. I am going to be patient. I just drive around it.

Council Member Thompson stated I do think we should take a certain amount of money and have a contractor run around and fix potholes. I don't know what the budget looks like as to how much money we are bringing in but I do think there is some value in crisis management and just going around and doing potholes.

Council Member Sands stated that would be something you would do anyway, not necessarily road levy money but money in addition to that.

ADMINISTRATIVE STAFF COMMENTS

Mayor Arriola stated we will go to administrative staff comments.

Mayor Arriola stated Police Chief Daulton.

Police Chief Daulton stated I finished up the stats for 2019, Officers had 2840 dispatches for the year; took 496 written reports; in the month of January took 50 reports and there was 49 traffic stops.

Mayor Arriola stated anything else for the Police Chief.

Council Member Perkins dated at the last meeting I ask you about the gentleman that was here with the dog problem, the fence and the cars.

Council Member Sands stated you mean Mr. Bundy.

Council Member Perkins stated yes. Anyway one of those cars doesn't have any license plates on it.

Police Chief stated I talked with the officers about that about 2 days ago. They have been keeping an eye on that during the nighttime and they have been checking every car that is parked there to make sure it is properly registered.

Council Member Perkins stated there is one on Gregory, right before the stop sign.

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Mayor Arriola asked do you have an address?

Council Member Perkins stated I know it right before the stop sign and it is on the corner. It is a truck.

Mayor Arriola stated heading west on Gregory.

Council Member Perkins stated yes.

Council Member Thompson stated based upon your 2019 stats is there anything that alarms you.

Police Chief Daulton stated no. It is pretty consistent in the past years. The actual number of dispatches is probably down some because a lot of the initiated stuff the Officers do they do not take a dispatch number because we get billed for dispatch.

Mayor Arriola stated any other questions. Nothing was heard.

Mayor Arriola stated Fire Chief Keyser.

Fire Chief Keyser stated I think when I look at the stats for this month they are going to be staggering. We are running 3 to 5 consistently since the end of last month. We Are running 3 to 5 calls a day. When I returned from vacation I looked through the calls and we are running 3 to 5 medic calls a day.

Mayor Arriola asked are they very serious calls.

Fire Chief Keyser stated I do not know. It started in mid December and it has not slowed down.

Council Member Thompson asked do you think it is because of the warmer weather and there are more people running around?

Fire Chief Keyser stated a lot of people have the strain 2 of the flu and are having respiratory issues. Even my own wife had strain A and then caught strain B. I ended up taking her to urgent care because her breathing was so bad. I think the flu is playing a big part right now.

Mayor Arriola stated any questions for Fire Chief Keyser.

Vice Mayor Macmann asked what does it mean charged per dispatch.

Fire Chief Keyser stated whenever they create a screen whenever we have a fire or police Englewood charges us. The dispatch center charges them a rate per call that they have to create a screen for and they charge the fire department per call per screen that they have to do. It's not a flat rate; you are billed by how many runs you take for the month.

Vice Mayor Macmann stated so if I call dispatch you get a charge

Police Chief Daulton stated it all depends. There would be a charge for that but if it's just the basic place the officer stopped by then it is not a charge. It is not considered a Charge they just send a message out to the officers

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Vice Mayor Macmann stated if I call from the library and would like to have an officer stop by and walk through the branch for whatever reason that would not generate charges.

Police Chief Daulton stated no. A lot of things that we self initiate are business security checks and get out to do vacation house checks. Things like are not called out as dispatch, they just log it and we are charged. By all means please do not hesitate to call.

Vice Mayor Macmann stated thank you. I was just trying to understand.

Council Member Perkins asked is there a way we can get the month back when you're going out for emergency to pick up a person

Fire Chief Keyser stated if you are a resident because you pay taxes. Then whatever is left that your insurance company does not pay or whatever you don't pay your taxes cover it. If you are a non-resident and you don't pay taxes here you have to pay that bill. We don't do our own billing. It is a third party company that we contract with so they are responsible for all collections.

Council Member Perkins stated if you have insurance it will cover it.

Fire Chief Keyser stated not all of it.

Mayor Arriola stated any other questions for the Fire Chief. Nothing was heard.

Mayor Arriola stated Code Enforcement Administrator.

Code Enforcement Administrator stated I have nothing tonight sir.

Mayor Arriola stated any questions for Melody.

Council Member Sands asked what is going on with the houses on Tarragon

Code Enforcement Administrator stated it is under new people now. (not audible)

Mayor Arriola stated anybody else have anything for Melody. Nothing was heard.

Mayor Arriola stated Chief Financial Officer.

Chief Financial Officer Etter stated I have nothing, sir.

Mayor Arriola stated any questions for her. Nothing was heard.

Mayor Arriola stated do I have a motion to adopt the January 2020 Financial Report.

Motion by Council Member Sands, second by Council Member Macmann to adopt January 2020 Financial Report.
