WATER DEPARTMENT

WATER METER NOTICE

Property owners must maintain a passage way to their water meter and keep the meter accessible for reading or removal at all times. We ask that the water meter have a sufficient amount of space around the water meter pit for our Water Department to kneel and access the meter from any angle as needed for meter reading and/ or removal of the meter.

The Village must have access to the premises supplied with water at all reasonable hours in order to read meters and to see that all rules are observed or to make any necessary examinations of the plumbing and water fixtures. In the case the meter cannot be read in an appropriate amount of time, the service may be shut off until a reading is obtained and the bill is paid.

VILLAGE STREET UPDATE

AS WE APPROACH THE RENEWAL OF OUR STREET LEVY On the November 7, 2023 ballot, will be the renewal five mill street levy. As this is a renewal, there is **no increase in taxes**. Since the initial passage of the levy in 2015, this levy has allowed the Village to repair and resurface streets throughout the village. The levy to date has allowed us to resurface/repair the following fourteen streets: N. Clayton, Lufkin, Gregory, Avon Oak, part of Lawson Ave, Gloria, Marilee, Capri PI, part of Bronwood, Laredo, Yorkwood, Yale off S. Church St., S. Clayton Rd, and Johnsville-Brookville Rd to corp. line. Our 2023 Levy project was Waite Ave and part of Homeway Ave. The streets throughout the Village need attention and with the passage of the renewal street levy, we will be able to continue repairing and resurfacing the streets. The continuation of this levy allows additional streets to be repaired and resurfaced over the next five years at **no additional cost to the taxpayer**.

Phase I and II OPWC/Small Government Grant: Blosser St. Project is currently on track to be completed within the anticipated timeline or potentially sooner than expected. This project included underground utilities, curb, gutter, storm sewer, and two courses of asphalt.

Phase III Blosser St Project has been approved for OPWC and Small Government Grant. Phase III will include Comer Court and is currently ready for bid.

CHARTER REVIEW BOARD

2023 saw the appointment and meeting of the Charter Review Board.

The New Lebanon Municipal Charter began in 1979 and is reviewed by an appointed board every ten years. The board met the challenge and after their review, the board has approved 12 charter amendments to be on the November 7, 2023 ballot to be considered by the voters of New Lebanon.

The proposed changes and ballot language will soon be made available to the public once approved by Board of Elections. Stay tuned — it will be posted to the Village Offices, Village website at newlebanonoh.org, and the Board of Elections website.

GENERAL ELECTION

Deadline to register to vote in the November 7th General Election is October 10th. Applications for absentee ballots to be mailed for the November 7th General Election must be received by Boards of Elections by end of business day October 31st.
